Dear Parents & Carers Happiness and wonder inspires success

Day Care have had to close this week due to all their staff being ill and testing positive for COVID. They will be open as usual on Monday and hopefully they are all fully recovered. Covid seems to be a part of life these days so please be vigilant and test if you think you or your child may have it. Our attendance is not good at the moment but we think you will agree that it is better safe than sorry.

Next Monday the school nurses are coming to carry out height and weight checks on the children in Reception.

On Monday, we also have our first face to face meeting about our Year 2 project with Birmingham Arts school where we will be joined with people from Bellfield Junior School and Longwill School.

It is Miss Coulston last day in school today as she starts her maternity leave next week. We wish her all the best and we can't wait to finally meet her baby when she is up and about.

Some of you may be wondering where Mrs Kulas has been; unfortunately she suffered an accident and broke her collar bone so can't be in school until she's better. We all wish her a speedy recovery.

We had a Full Governing Body meeting on Tuesday evening and this was the one we had to postpone from December. The Head Teacher's Report informed them of what was happening in school and the results from the assessments of the children at the end of the first term of the year. We also had feedback from the governors who had been in school and what they had seen. Most importantly we welcomed our new member, Mr Hopkins, who has volunteered to join our Governing Body. He has a wealth of experience and will really be able to contribute to our meetings and help oversee the running of our school.



Unfortunately, next Wednesday (1st February) we shall have to close the school to all pupils and only the Day Care will be open as usual. The teaching union,

NEU, has advised its members to strike and as the majority of our staff belong to the NEU they have to follow their guidance which is to strike. We looked at the feasibility of opening for some children but following DfE guidance on how to cover and what the ratio child to adult should be, we are unable to meet the guidance. As an infant school the adult to pupil ratios are much smaller compared to older children. We have given you as much notice as we could and thankfully my staff have been open and honest and shared their intentions whereas in some schools they won't know until there's a no show on the morning of the strike. My staff have not taken this decision lightly and feel that education is becoming increasingly underfunded and therefore are willing to lose a day's pay to stand up for what they want, which is a better financed education for your children.

A letter from our Chair of Governors was sent this morning with an important announcement. I hope that you have had a chance to read it. Governors will be focusing on a suitable successor in the coming weeks and you will be kept updated on this.
